Chairman's Report

Dear Fathers,

I am pleased to share with you the 2022-2023 annual report for the Priests' Retirement Foundation (PRF), with many thanks for your ongoing support and prayers.

The PRF assists our retired priests in many ways. This includes accommodation, assistance with board and lodging expenses, nursing home and hostel care for frail priests, health insurance, medical and dental expenses, motor vehicles, and in many other ways.

As you can see from the financial report for the year ended 30th June 2023, the PRF earned a surplus of \$2,012,606, which included bequests and donations of \$2.4M. Without these, the result would have been a deficit of \$380,000, so we are most grateful for the generosity of those who have supported the PRF this way, as each year it does rely heavily on this form of income.

The annual Father's Day appeal was again very important with the \$573,000 raised by the Parishes being matched by the Archdiocese on a 2 to 1 basis, contributing \$1,147,724 during the year.

The balance sheet at year end shows that Foundation remains in a sound financial position, but its ability to be able to support its current retired priests and those retiring in the future still depends on your continued support, especially by promoting the annual Father's Day appeal.

I pray you will feel encouraged by the support you have provided to the PRF this past year and will continue to do so, and keep the works of the Foundation in your prayers.

My thanks to the PRF Committee for their good work during the year, and the Chancery Staff who supported us in meeting our responsibilities, and the Development and Fundraising Office for its promotion and fundraising.

Special thanks to Michael King for the great support and friendship he has provided to our retired priests throughout the year.

In conclusion I know I speak on behalf of all of those involved in the running of the Foundation that it is our privilege to support and care for the 65 priests currently retired in Sydney.

Thank you once again for promoting the needs of the Foundation.

Even in retirement many priests continue to serve, such as through the celebration of weekend Masses or assisting as chaplains. Thank you for your selfless ministry.






